Dr. Melles is a cornea specialist and founder of the Netherlands Institute for Innovative Ocular Surgery, the Melles Cornea Clinic Rotterdam, and Amnitrans EyeBank Rotterdam. A renowned cornea surgeon, he was a pioneer in developing many of the lamellar keratoplasty techniques in use today, including Descemet membrane endothelial keratoplasty and Bowman layer transplantation. He has also developed instruments and medical devices, in

Earn Credits Through Aug. 1, 2023

Whether you attend AAO 2022 live or virtually, CME credits are available, up

to a combined maximum of 50 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

You can claim CME credit multiple times, up to the 50-credit maximum, through Aug. 1, 2023. This means you can claim some in 2022 and some in 2023, or all in the same year.

Proof of Vaccination Is Required for the In-Person Meeting

The Academy is committed to your safety at AAO 2022. The Board of Trustees has determined that proof of COVID-19 vaccination is required for all AAO 2022 attendees. Academy members and staff, exhibitors, and guests will be required to show proof of vaccination to pick up their badges.

Before you arrive. Make sure you have a copy or photo of your proof of vaccination. It should clearly show which vaccine you received and the dates you received each shot.

When you arrive. Proceed directly to Registration in South Hall A to present your documentation. Once you have your AAO 2022 badge, you will not need to show proof of vaccination again unless you lose your badge.
