### CASEBEER LECTURE AWARD

Stephen D. Klyce, PhD (United States)

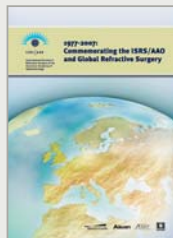
