What's new with airport security? For the dos and don'ts of airline travel, read the U.S. government's flight tips at www.tsa.gov.

From the airport to downtown Atlanta. The Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport is 10 miles from downtown Atlanta. The Airport Information and Ground Transportation Center, located in the arrivals lobby, provides assistance and information on the transportation options for getting to your hotel.

If you take a taxi, the set fee between the airport and downtown is \$30, with a \$2 charge for each additional person. Taxicab service is located in the Red Bus aisle.

the Atlanta Link departs every 10 to 15 minutes. It goes to hotels in Downtown (\$16.50), Midtown (\$18.50) and Buckhead (\$20.50), and it also goes to the convention center (\$16.50). To purchase tickets on arrival, go to the Ground Transportation Information Center. Or to purchase tickets in advance (and save \$2), you can either

make reservations online, at www.theatlantalink.com, or by phone, at 1-404-524-3400. Atlanta Link shuttles are located outside the Delta Baggage Claim South Terminal, exit doors S-5 and S-6, in the middle island.

Traveling between your hotel and the convention center. There will be a shuttle bus service operating between most of the official Joint Meeting hotels and the convention center during meeting hours from Saturday through Tuesday. There will be limited service on Friday. The Shuttle Schedule will be published in your *Pocket Guide*, and it will be available to download to your PDA from the Meeting E-Guide.

Check your hotel lobby for updated shuttle bus information.

If you take a taxi, the meter rate is \$2.50 for the first eighth of a mile and 25 cents for each additional eighth of a mile.



TICKET SALES. Visit the course boards, located in Hall A-2, to see what Instruction Courses and Labs are still available.

If you take the subway, the convention center is served by the not-so-pithily named Dome/GWCC/Philips Arena/CNN Center Station. For schedules and maps, visit the Web site of the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) at www.itsmarta.com.

If you drive, seven parking lots are operated by the convention center. The Campus Courtesy Shuttle provides free shuttle service between these parking lots and the main entrance to the

convention center. To download maps and directions, go to www.aao.org/2008 and select “Hotels and Travel.”

The flight home. Don’t forget to verify your flight’s departure time (see the box below). If you’re going straight from the convention center to the airport, you can store your luggage at the coat check in the Entrance Concourse (\$1 for a coat; \$2 for a bag). For a bus to the airport, look for the “Airport Shuttle” sign outside the Entrance Concourse. You should buy

The Fastest Options for Getting Your Badge and Tickets

Beat the clock—Oct. 15 is the last call for preregistration. Take advantage of preregistration fees, as most registration categories and ticket fees increase on site. Registration via fax and mail is closed, but you have until Oct. 15 to register and buy tickets online at www.aao.org/2008. Materials will not be mailed to you. Instead, you will be e-mailed a bar code, which you can swipe at the Express Registration & Badge Pickup area. If you don’t have that bar code, you can still use Express Registration, but you will need to bring your photo ID and then type in either your name or member ID.

If you preregistered by Sept. 10, your registration materials will be mailed to you:

- If you registered for the Joint Meeting, you will be sent a Joint Meeting badge, a badge holder, a *Final Program* exchange voucher and, if applicable, a ribbons voucher.
- If you registered for Subspecialty Day, you will be sent a *Syllabus* exchange voucher.
- If you registered for events or tours, you will be sent the relevant tickets.

If you miss the Oct. 15 deadline for preregistration, you can use the Express Registration terminals if you 1) belong to a membership category that doesn’t pay a reg-

istration fee and 2) don’t owe membership dues.

If you need to buy event tickets, you can do so at the Ticket Sales area.

If you need to buy Spouse and Guest Tour tickets, you can do so at the Ticket Sales area. If somebody needs to register as a spouse or guest, he or she can do that at the Registration Services area.

Bring your photo ID. Registrars may ask you for identification.

#3 CME reporting—A-B Connector, Entrance Concourse and Academy Resource Center (Hall B-4, Booth #3532). For instructions on reporting CME, see below.

#4 E-mail and Internet access—A-B Connector and Technology Pavilion (Hall B-5, Booth #5243). Use AAO Communication Central to access e-mail, browse the Internet, exchange messages with fellow attendees and search the Virtual Exhibition.

#5 Final Program—at the “Bags & Programs” counters in Hall A-2. Turn in your *Final Program* exchange voucher to pick up your attendee bag, which will include your *Final Program*, the Locator Map: Unofficial Satellite Symposia and other helpful materials.

#6 Housing desk—Entrance Concourse. If you have any questions about your hotel reservation, and if you booked your room through the Joint Meeting’s official housing company, Expovision, you can talk to staff at the Housing desk.

#10 Wi-Fi access at the AAOasis—Hall B-1, Booth #141 and Hall B-5, Booth #5233. If you bring your laptop, you can go online at the two AAOasis Wi-Fi HotSpots. If you’d like to access Scientific Posters Online, Videos on Demand, AAO Communication Central or the Message Center, these are all available through the Wi-Fi connections.

How to Report CME

Before processing requests for CME credit, the Academy must be able to verify your attendance at Subspecialty Day and/or the Joint Meeting.

First, verify your attendance. For auditing purposes, you must do one of the following:

- register and receive materials in advance, turn in the *Final Program* and/or *Subspecialty Day Syllabus* exchange voucher(s) on site,
- pick up materials on site at the Preregistration counter if materials did not arrive before you traveled to the meeting,
- register on site, or
- use your ExpoCard on site at the meeting.

Next, report your CME. There are three ways to report credits earned during the Subspecialty Day, Joint Meeting or Coding Camp:

- visit one of the CME Credit Reporting booths, which are located in the A-B Connector, in the Entrance

Concourse and in the Academy Resource Center (Hall B-4, Booth #3532),

- you can also fill out the CME form that is in your *Final Program* and hand it in at the Member Services desk in the Academy Resource Center, or
- if you are an Academy member and your attendance is verified, you will be able to report those CME credits on the Academy’s Web site (www.aa.org/cme) from Dec. 17 until Jan. 21. CME credits must be submitted by Jan. 21.

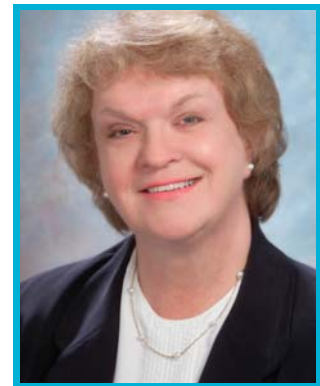

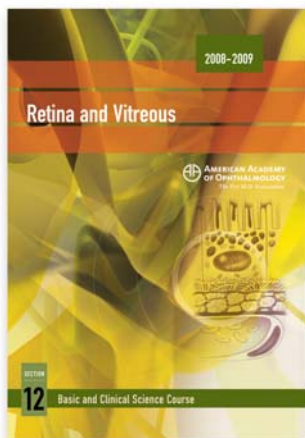

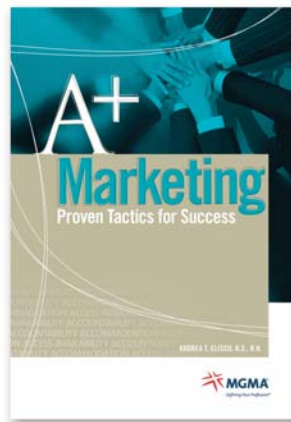
