


MEETING AMBASSADOR PROGRAM



Self-Assessment Credit

German State Chambers of Physicians Recognition of Certificates of Attendance

The German State Chambers of Physicians now automatically recognizes certificates of attendance for live, in-person Continuing Medical Education (CME) activities organized by accredited providers in the ACCME System. These activities must take place in the United States or its territories. This decision is limited to five years, expiring in November 2021.

Complete your trip to the City by the Bay with a visit to world-famous Fisherman's Wharf. Partake in fresh seafood, sourdough bread and gorgeous views; watch the barking sea lions bask in the sun at Pier 39; and tour the USS Pampanito submarine.

Weather

San Francisco in October is usually very comfortable with clear blue skies. Average highs are 70°F/21°C and lows are typically 54°F/12°C. Bring a jacket or other warm clothes to wear in the evenings or if sightseeing, as it can get windy.
