Spotlight on Cataract Complications: M&M Rounds—Learning From My Mistakes (Spo2). Eighteen cataract experts will each present a video case showing a complication that taught them valuable lessons. Paired panelists will then comment on the cases and the "teaching points." The audience will weigh in using response pads. The symposium concludes with the 11th annual Charles D. Improving Your Odds in Anterior Segment Surgery (Sym31). Experts discuss the newest advances in cataract surgery, including intraoperative guidance systems, phaco technology, new intraocular lenses, and new surgical techniques. Lessons Learned About New Technologies for Refractive Cataract Surgery (Sym35). Join the discussion about 4 new technologies: extended depth-of-focus IOLs, corneal inlays, trifocals, and toric multifocals. Discover: New Surgery Skills

Skills Transfer labs and lectures provide the opportunity to master new diagnostic and surgical techniques. They include intensive training sessions, a hands-on learning environment, and outstanding instructors. Note that a ticket is required for Skills Transfer labs but that lectures are included in the Academy Plus course pass. Attendance at each lab's accompanying lecture is strongly recommended but not required. Highlights include:

This web-based application gives you access to a myriad of useful meeting content and can be used on any web-enabled device.

The MMG also contains listings for satellite symposia and related group events, as well as refractive surgery e-posters, scientific posters online, videos on demand, and Technology Pavilion and Learning Lounge schedules.
