This award acknowledges the impact young ophthalmologists have had on the Academy for the past several decades. Since the YO Committee's inception in the late 1990s, and with the addition of three YO Subcommittees, we have brought a significant voice along with more effective and diverse representation to the Academy.

 The YO Info Editorial Board has produced a well-received e-newsletter distributed monthly to YOs around the globe. YO Info features clinical pearls written by and for YOs, as well as many other topics. Special editions are produced each year including the Resident Edition, Graduate Edition and International Edition.

- The YO Advocacy Subcommittee has engaged YOs at the state and federal levels. Its most significant outcome has been its contributions to the Advocacy Ambassador Program. Residents and fellowship trainees come to Washington, D.C., each year for the Academy's Mid-Year Forum to learn and participate alongside seasoned advocates.
- The YO International Subcommittee has focused on facilitating the

  and collaborating on joint educational sessions specific to YOs.
  YO committees are now prevalent in state, subspecialty, regional,
  national and supranational ophthalmology societies.
