 - e. Suture brand, material, length and needle used in the various procedures

2. All your phaco settings. (Ask the surgical rep for the machine you use to e-mail you these.)

- a. Different grades of cataracts
- b. Low-flow settings for floppy iris cases
- c. Anterior vitrectomy settings
- d. Have surgical rep at new surgical center present at first case to program your machine

3. All the surgical consent forms — major and minor surgeries.

- a. YAG capsulotomy
- b. Chalazion excision
- c. Punctal plug placement
- d. Lid lesion excision
- e. Generic minor procedure form
- f. Cataract (including premium IOL info sheet/consent)
- g. Refractive surgery (info and consent)

4. All exam forms.

- a. New patient exam
- b. Follow-up full exam
- c. Follow-up quick exam
- d. Post-op exam
- e. New patient forms
- 5. Any educational handouts that you use regularly to explain eye conditions, treatments or preop/post-op care. (Have these e-mailed to you, if possible, as electronic versions are best.)
- 6. Your favorite eye model (as long as it's yours to take!) or eye photo that you use to explain eye conditions and surgeries.
- 7. All the contact information for your mentors and professors, including e-mail address, cell, pager, etc.
