Which courses should I register for?

If you are taking the Demonstration of Ophthalmic Cognitive Knowledge (DOCK) examination, you should register for the PEAs you have selected for the DOCK examination. The DOCK examination consists of three sections: Core (required) and two PEAs of your choice. Note: you may choose to take two DOCK sections in all PEAs except Refractive Management/Intervention and Uveitis. (For example, you may choose to take two DOCK sections in retina/vitreous.) Should I register for two days or three days?

If you are taking the course to prepare for the DOCK examination, the number of days you select to register for depends on which sections you have elected to take for the DOCK examination. For example:

1. If you have elected to take the three DOCK examination sections: Core-required (one section); Cataract (one section); Glaucoma (one section), you should register for the 3-day course and attend

the glaucoma course on Friday, Core Ophthalmic Knowledge on Saturday, and the cataract course on Sunday.

2. If you have elected to take the three DOCK examination sections: Core-required (one section); and cataract (two sections), you should register for the 2-day course and attend Core Ophthalmic Knowledge on Saturday and the cataract course on Sunday.

If you are taking this course for a review, please choose those PEAs of interest to you and register for the appropriate number of days.

May I register for two PEA courses on the same day i.e. two on Friday?

No, you must register for just one course on Friday and/or Sunday.

How long do the courses last and how many can I attend each day?

You may register for just one course per day. The courses run concurrently all day on Friday and Sunday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and on Saturday the Core Ophthalmic Knowledge course runs from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

May I change my course selection after I register?

May I change my course selection onsite?
