The reviews are all in question-and-answer format—question on one slide, answer on the next. If you use the PDF format, be sure to switch to *Presentation Mode* so the slides 'flip' (the Q&A format is hard to follow when the images are scrolled).

The Optics slide-sets constitute a tutorial. They are intended to teach optics from the ground up—no prior knowledge of the subject is needed. Being a tutorial, the Optics slide-sets are meant to be read in order. You are of course free to read them in any order you like, but fair warning: Later sets refer frequently to concepts mentioned in earlier ones ('Recall in Chapter 11 when we said...'), and you might find yourself lost.

The non-Optics slide-sets are all standalone, and thus can be read *ad lib*. My suggestion is that you read about a topic in the *BCSC* books, then work your way through its slide-set. <u>To find the relevant slide-set</u>, search for keywords in the <u>Table of Contents</u>.

You are free to use the PowerPoint versions for didactics, and to modify them to suit your purposes. However, I ask that you not distribute or circulate any sets that have been modified.
