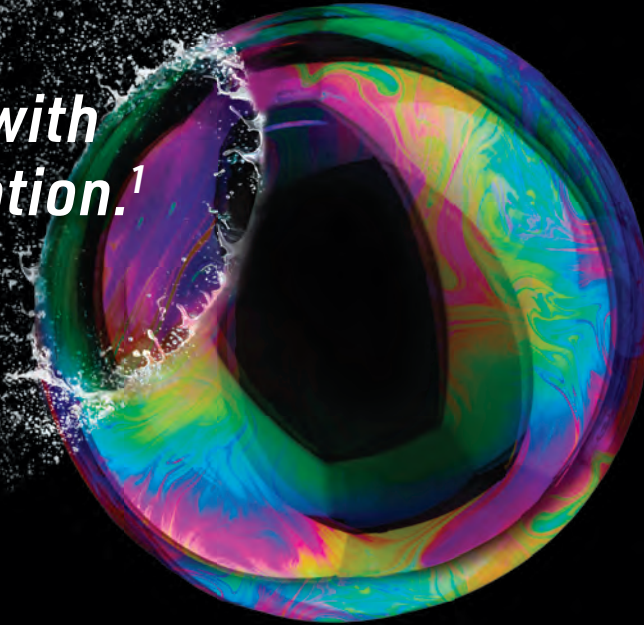

REFRACTIVE SURGERY 2022:

Refractive Surgery in the New Age

Directors' preview. The past two years have produced a significant change in the way we all practice ophthalmology. Although this has been a stressful time, refractive surgery has seen a growth in the number of procedures performed worldwide. In addition, there has been continued innovation and development in both new software and hardware for refractive surgery.

This year, the theme of the Refractive Surgery Subspecialty Day, the annual meeting of the International Society of Refractive Surgery, is "Refractive Surgery in the New Age." The "new age" is the era in which we learn to live with the COVID-19 virus instead of shutting down our practices and putting our lives on hold. Many of the lessons we have learned in the way we practice will be highlighted. There will be lectures on new approaches to performing refractive consults, as well as a session on new refractive technologies that became available in 2022. The meeting will also highlight "Pearls From Around the World," reflecting the international nature of the meeting and showcasing tips and best practices from leading cataract and refractive surgeons worldwide. The popular video-based session will focus specifically on complications and how to manage them.

To combat the stress of the last two years, a new session on mindfulness, ergonomics, and self-healing is sure to offer some advice of interest to all of us. It is a busy program, full of innovative tips and techniques. We are confident that everyone will find something meaningful to take back to their practices and, more important, to their personal lives!
