



How to Get Evaluation Forms

Scan your badge at each AAO 2016 session that you attend to receive an email at the end of the day with a link to an evaluation. If you missed your chance to be scanned, go to Ticket Sales (South, Hall A). The evaluation link will automatically be sent to those who purchase tickets for Subspecialty Day meetings, Saturday's AAOE coding sessions, and ticketed events. Scanning your badge does not automatically grant CME. You still need to record educational activities at a CME Reporting station onsite or online after the meeting. Be Sure to Claim CME

The Academy is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to provide continuing medical education for physicians.
