#### REGISTRATION

#### Register by Sept. 29

Register today for AAO 2021 (Nov. 12-15), Subspecialty Day meetings (Nov. 12-13), and the half-day AAOE coding sessions (Nov. 12). On Sept. 30, registration fees for specific registration categories and ticket fees increase.

Register today, decide later! Your AAO 2021 registration is fully transferrable between in-person or virtual until Oct. 29. If you decide you cannot travel, email registration@aao.org, and no processing fee will be assessed. Also, when you register for the in-person meeting you will have access to all AAO 2021 virtual content.

AAO 2021 registration includes access to instruction courses. Scan the barcode or type your name into the computer to print your badge. Photo ID will be required. Badges will not be mailed.

#### Can't Make It to New Orleans? Register for AAO 2021 Virtual

#### Search the Program

#### Earn Credits Through Aug. 1, 2022

Whether you attend AAO 2021 live or virtually, CME credits are available, up to a combined maximum of 50 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity. You can claim CME credit multiple times, up to the 50-credit maximum, through Aug. 1, 2022. This means you can claim some in 2021 and some in 2022, or all in the same year.

**Get verified.** Before the Academy can process your requests for CME credit, your attendance at AAO 2021 and/or Subspecialty Day must be verified.

In person. Picking up your badge onsite will verify your attendance (badges are no longer mailed).

Virtually. Signing into the meeting platform, whether for AAO 2021 or Subspecialty Day, will verify your attendance.

Being verified as an attendee does not automatically grant CME. You still need to claim your CME credits.

Report credits online only. You will not find reporting kiosks in the convention center. Attendees can claim credits by accessing the link in the Mobile Meeting Guide or through the Academy's website.

#### **NEURO-OPHTHALMOLOGY 2021: Common Concerns, Uncommon Problems: Clues to Finding the Hidden Dangers!**

When: Friday, Nov. 12 (8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.).

This predominantly case-based Subspecialty Day meeting will discuss double vision, optic nerve disease, systemic disease, and headache and eye pain, as well as new and evolving therapies and diagnostic modalities for neuro-ophthalmic disorders.

Audience participation is expected—there will be audience response questions, and the audience will be able to text pertinent questions to the panelists. An audience participation game called "Choose Your Own Clinical Pathway" will return this year. Members of the audience will decide what the next step will be in the care of select patients presented as unknowns. At each step of the presentation, the audience will be presented with choices. They will then see the consequences of their clinical decision-making. This system will also give the panel an opportunity to comment on the

clinical decision-making process.

Also returning, popular panelist point-counterpoint discussions will allow attendees to review controversies such as the following: When and how should optic atrophy be worked up? What to do when the amaurosis workup is negative? What is the best approach for a patient with headache?
