

Don't Miss the Opening Session

The Opening Session takes place in the Esplanade Ballroom, Moscone South, from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 4. You'll hear from Academy leadership and honor winners of Academy Awards. The 2023 Laureate Award will be presented to H. Dunbar Hoskins Jr., MD, an internationally recognized glaucoma specialist who served as the Academy's Executive Vice President for 16 years.

Eve J. Higginbotham, SM, MD, ML, will deliver the 80th annual Edward Jackson Memorial Lecture, "Striving Toward Better Eye Health Beyond Our Waiting Rooms." Dr. Higginbotham is the inaugural Vice Dean for Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity of the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. She is also Senior Fellow at the Leonard Davis Institute for Health Economics and Professor of Ophthalmology specializing in glaucoma.

Hear Original Research

Many AAO 2023 sessions highlight cutting-edge science, including original papers sessions and scientific posters. Original papers presentations, to take place in West 2006, are divided into 12 sessions by topic. Paper presentations are followed by a panel discussion. At the end of each session, the panel selects the best paper. In addition, 15 sessions are scheduled for the Poster Theater (West Booth 7337). Each moderated discussion focuses on a specific topic—from cataract to uveitis.

REGISTRATION

It's Not Too Late to Register

You can still register for AAO 2023 (Friday, Nov. 3, through Monday, Nov. 6) online through the end of the meeting.

What's included. When you register for the in-person meeting, you gain access to more than 60 symposia and 260 instruction courses, plus Skills Transfer didactic lectures, original papers sessions, videos, and poster presentations. You can also access the AAO 2023 Expo and AAO 2023 Virtual meeting.

Remember to purchase tickets. Remember to purchase tickets to Skills Transfer labs and Friday Intensives. Register separately for Subspecialty Day meetings and AAOE Practice Management half-day coding sessions. You can register and purchase tickets online through the end of the meeting.

Subspecialty Day. Registration for the in-person Subspecialty Day meetings (Friday, Nov. 3, and Saturday, Nov. 4) includes the flexibility to float among Subspecialty Day meetings taking place the same day. When to log in. CME

Earn Credits Through 2024

Whether you attend AAO 2023 and Subspecialty Day meetings live or virtually, CME credits are available. You can claim AMA PRA Category 1 Credits multiple times, up to the credit maximum, through March 29, 2024. You can claim some in 2023 and some in 2024, or all in the same year.

For AAO 2023, the combined max-

imum is up to 50 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits.

For 2023 Subspecialty Day, the combined maximum is up to 12 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits per day.

There is no need to track which sessions you attend, just the total number of hours you spend in sessions for each claim. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

To obtain a proof of attendance letter, you need to complete the CME credit reporting process, which may include a short meeting evaluation survey. You will be able to print a certificate/proof of attendance letter from the claim website. Your certificate will also be emailed.
